Subject: **REORIENTATION OF THE 2018 PHILIPPINE INFORMAL READING INVENTORY (PHIL-IRI) FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL HEADS AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS DISTRICT SUPERVISORS/DISTRICT IN - CHARGE**

Date: April 15, 2019

1. The Department of Education through the Bureau of Learning Delivery envisions that every Filipino child should be a reader. One of the initiatives to address its thrust is the administration of the Philippine Informal Reading Inventory (Phil – IRI) which is anchored on Every Child A Reader Program (ECARP).
2. The first division orientation was conducted to all District Reading Coordinators last June, 2018. They were required to do the same orientation to all concerned in the district and school levels. However, per observation during division monitoring activities, Phil – IRI is not yet fully understood by some concerned personnel.
3. In view thereof, a **Reorientation of the 2018 Philippine Informal Reading Inventory (Phil IRI) for Elementary School Heads and Public Schools District Supervisors/District In-Charge** is hereby scheduled as shown below.
